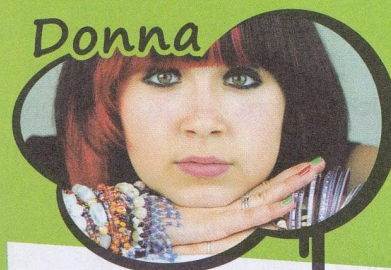


Ethan

Antoni Gaudí's Work of Art

Anyone who has ever visited Barcelona has seen the works of the city's most famous architect, Antoni Gaudí. Gaudí was born in Reus, Spain, in 1852, and studied architecture in Barcelona between 1873 and 1878. He spent most of his life there and designed many wonderful buildings like the Casa Batlló, the Casa Mila and Park Güell.

The Sagrada Família however, is his most famous work and has become a symbol of Barcelona. Gaudí started this project in 1883 and spent the rest of his life working on it. He wanted to build a very impressive cathedral with 18 towers up to 170 metres high. When he died in 1926, only a small part was ready. Work continued, but in 1936 a bomb ruined Gaudí's study with all his notes and designs.

In 1952, a team of architects decided to make Gaudí's dream come true. They started work on the Sagrada Família again. They have already built the facade and most of the towers. Four of the towers are open to visitors and provide amazing views of the city. However, work on the cathedral hasn't finished yet and probably won't for quite some time.

SIGN LANGUAGE

The ancient Greek philosopher Aristotle believed that people could learn only by hearing spoken words. In the 18th century, the invention of sign language changed people's opinions. The first school for deaf people was opened in Paris in the 1750s by Abbe Charles Michel L'Épée. He created a language of signs that became known as Old French Sign Language, and it spread throughout Europe as more and more schools were opened.

Sign language is the system of signs and gestures that deaf people use to communicate. Today, almost every country has its own sign language. For example in the UK, there is BSL (British Sign Language) and in the USA, ASL (American Sign Language). However, sign languages are very different from spoken languages. They have different grammar and vocabulary. Also, you can even express two or more signs at the same time.

So even though British and American people speak English, BSL and ASL aren't the same at all. However, in other countries things are different. South Africa has 11 official spoken languages but only one sign language. There is an international sign language called Gestuno, but this is only used at international deaf events, such as the Deaflympics, or the Olympics for the deaf.



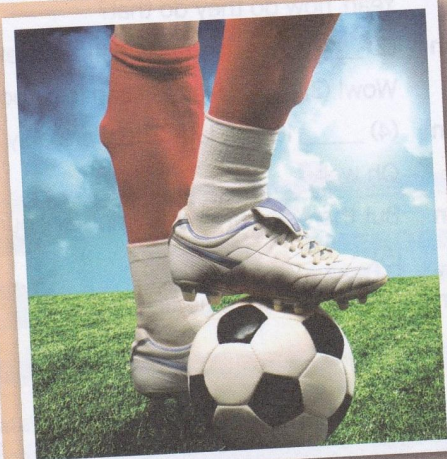

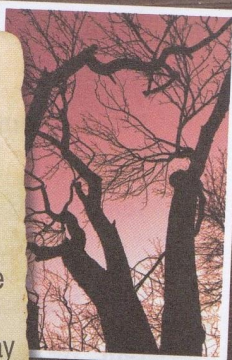
Old School Weather Forecasting!

In the past people didn't have technology so they had to use other ways to predict the weather. Here are a few.

You can actually predict the weather just by touching grass. If the grass is dry when the sun rises, then it means it will be cloudy or there will be strong winds, which can mean rain that day. If the grass is wet, then it probably won't rain. But this method doesn't work if it has rained during the night.



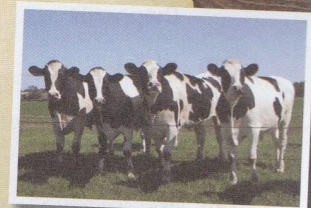
Another good thing to know is that most storms travel from west to east. So, if you see a rainbow in the west, then rain is probably coming. Also, if you see a red sky in the west during the evening, it means lots of dry air with dust in it is heading towards you. But a red sky in the morning means the dry air has passed and rain is coming. This is why people say 'Red sky at night, sailor's delight. Red sky in the morning, sailors take warning.'



Clouds can tell you a lot about the weather, too. If they are moving in different directions, (some towards the west and others towards the north), bad weather is coming. Also, there are some clouds called *Alto cumulus clouds*, which are high in the sky and have a spotted pattern. Sailors always believed they brought storms. And it's true, these clouds usually mean rain within the next 36 hours.



Lastly, looking at animals can also help you guess what the weather will be like. Cows usually crowd together just before a storm, or sometimes they lie down. And most animals, especially birds, go quiet just before it rains.

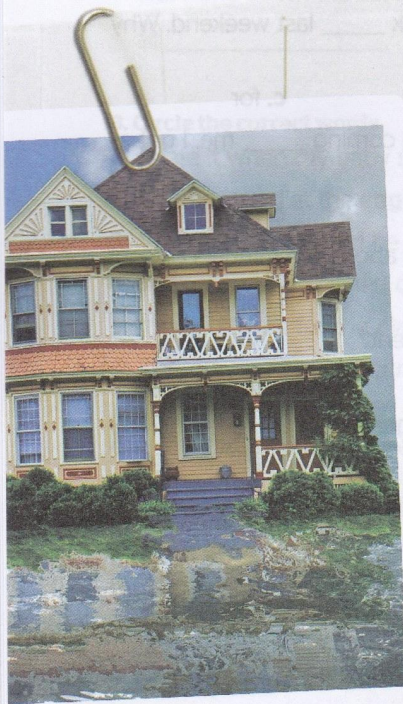
WHAT A NIGHT!

THE KING OF PLANETS!

Jupiter is the largest planet in our solar system. It's so big that you could fit fourteen Earths inside it! It's also one of the brightest objects in the night sky. Actually, when seen from Earth, Jupiter is the third brightest object in the sky at night after the Moon and Venus. So it's quite easy to find it even without a telescope.

Now, if you look at Jupiter through a telescope, you will see some of its moons. Can you guess how many moons it's got? Well, there seem to be at least forty-nine, but astronomers are still finding new ones. Galileo Galilei discovered the first four moons in 1610. They are called Io, Europa, Ganymede and Callisto, or the Galilean moons. Ganymede is the largest moon in our solar system.

There are many other interesting facts worth knowing about Jupiter, too. For example, its year, which is the time it takes to go around the sun once, is very long. A year on Jupiter is almost twelve Earth years. But a day on this planet, which is the amount of time it takes to spin around itself once, is much shorter than a day on Earth - it's only about ten hours long. That's less than half an Earth day. Also, the most fascinating feature on Jupiter's surface is the Great Red Spot, which is a type of storm like a hurricane here on Earth. At its widest, this spot is about three times the size of the Earth! There are many storms happening around Jupiter but, there's no other storm bigger or older. Believe it or not, this storm started more than three hundred years ago! Amazing, right?

SLEEPING DISORDERS

There are many different problems you can have with sleeping. Some are medical problems where you need to see a doctor, others are just annoying.

Sleepwalking is probably the most common sleeping disorder. It can be just sitting up in bed while you're asleep or walking around and doing activities, where accidents can happen. These activities can include walking to the bathroom or cleaning but also dangerous activities like cooking or even driving. Some people have even said they were sleepwalking when they committed a crime. Sleepwalking can last from 30 seconds to 30 minutes. Sleepwalkers show no emotion on their faces and their eyes are open, however, they don't remember anything when they wake up.

Insomnia is not being able to sleep. This happens to most people at some point, but when it lasts for a long time it can be bad for your health. The Guinness World Records used to have world records for people staying awake, but they stopped because it's too dangerous. Some people have somniphobia, which is the fear of sleeping. They're too scared to go to sleep, perhaps because of nightmares that they've had, or sometimes they are scared they will die in their sleep. Narcolepsy, on the other hand, is not being able to stay awake. People with this disorder often don't sleep well at night. This causes them to be so tired during the day that they can't stop themselves from falling asleep. Obviously, this can be quite embarrassing.
